Reporting Course: SB-88

Compliance

Anyone who is currently using or diverting surface water from a stream, pond, or spring

is invited to a workshop on Friday June 29th from 8:00-11:00 a.m. in Eureka to learn

the newest water diversion requirements. Senate Bill 88 requires that all persons

whom divert or plan to divert (including stock ponds) more than 10 acre-feet of surface

water/year, to measure and report the water they use.

Goals of this workshop are to: 1) clarify reporting requirements, 2) identify appropriate

measurement systems for your property and diversion strategy, and 3) gain

certification in volume calculations and reporting. By attending this workshop

participants can meet the requirements to become a qualified individual when installing

and maintaining measurement devices and/or implementing measurement techniques.
